



Waiting Brings Blessings

No one has heard, no ear has perceived, no eye has seen any God besides you, who acts on behalf of those who wait for him. Isaiah 64:4

"I hate to wait. I hate to wait for a traffic light to turn green, for the doctor to see me, for the telephone to ring, for investments to produce, for the copier to warm up, for seeds to grow, for the fax to go through, for answers to prayer . . . I hate to wait. Period. Waiting is so hard, especially when I am waiting on the Lord. Sometimes He seems to be s-o-o-o s-l-o-w. But waiting is an essential part of spiritual discipline. It can be the ultimate test of our faith. If we grow impatient with waiting and take matters into our own hands, we will be in trouble. But if we wait on God, we will be blessed." – Lotz

The importance of waiting on God is illustrated in Stormie Omartian's book, **Just Enough Light for the Step I'm On . . .**

"I once knew a man who dashed frantically from one job to another, not because he needed the money, but because he was trying to make something happen for himself and secure his future. His commitment to the Lord was minimal; his obsession with success was paramount. His future is no more secure today than it has ever been, and he is still chasing after something that will forever elude him.

I know another man with the same kind of talent and abilities who chose to draw close to the Lord, humble and submit himself in every way, press into God's Word, and pray fervently for God's guidance. Doors flew open for him, some of which he didn't even dream of knocking on. He didn't try to make God fit *his* vision. He fit himself into *God's* vision. He didn't just do whatever he wanted to do, then ask God to bless it. He asked what God wanted him to do, and when he did it God blessed him.

Noah didn't one day decide he was going to build a giant boat and then, after he was finished, ask God to do something with it that would make him go down in history. Not at all. "Noah was a just man, perfect in his generations. Noah walked with God." (Genesis 6:9). This is worth repeating—**Noah walked with God**. And God blessed him. Abraham didn't suddenly say to Sarah one day, "Let's pull up stakes and wander in the desert, and then ask God to lead us somewhere." No, **Abraham walked with God**, and God told him to leave his country and go to a place He would show him. And God promised, "*I will bless you*" (Genesis 12:2). And God *did* bless him. Moses didn't just decide one day to go to Pharaoh and ask him to release a million people so they could leave town together. No, Moses was quietly minding his own flock as God had instructed him to do, when suddenly he heard the Lord call to him from the middle of a burning bush and *tell* him to go. When Moses waited for God's instructions, the Lord blessed everything he did.

These men were walking with God in their daily lives. God spoke to them and told them what to do. They did it. And God blessed them. Can there possibly be a lesson here for us? *You have a great future ahead and it will be reached as you move out of your past and walk step by step with God as He reveals Himself to you in the present.*

Just as you should not live in the past, resist the urge to live in the future also. Put your future in God's hands, trusting that he will never withhold anything good from you, and then stop worrying about it. This doesn't mean a trumpet will sound announcing that you are spiritually immature if you find yourself concerned about the future. God is not asking you to be perfect. He is asking you to allow *Him* to be perfect in you. God is asking you to trust that *He* has your future planned. Thinking too much about the future can keep you from fully living the life God has given you now.

This doesn't mean you can't have goals. But some people have goals that are so strong they *sacrifice* everything to achieve them, even their family and God. Instead of allowing the goal to come *from* God, the goal itself *becomes* god. Goals are not meant to be a plumb line to determine the shortest distance to success, but rather a compass to give a sense of direction."



There are two ways of waiting: patiently or impatiently. Learning to wait patiently is something God is still working on in my life. " I like a term coined by Smead called: **“W-A-I-T training.”** He states that “one workout we should regularly participate in is the exercise of patience.” **“Wait Training”** requires spiritual strength. Don't look for an alternate route, remember God's promise! . . . **No one has heard, no ear has perceived, no eye has seen any God besides you, who acts on behalf of those who wait for him.** Isaiah 64:4

“Because we are surrounded by technologies that make our lives faster and easier, we tend to think about spiritual realities in technological terms. We want to reap the very second we sow. We want God to microwave answers. MapQuest directions, and Twitter instructions. We want things to happen at the speed of light instead of the speed of a seed planted in the ground, but almost all spiritual realities in Scripture are described in agricultural terms. We want our dreams to become a reality overnight. We want our prayers answered immediately. But that Isn't the way it works in God's kingdom.

Until recently I attached an ASAP to every prayer. I wanted God to answer as soon as possible. But this is no longer my agenda. I don't want easy or quick answers because I have a tendency to mishandle the blessings that come too easily or too quickly. I take the credit for them, or I take them for granted. So now I pray it will take long enough and be hard enough for God to receive all of the glory.

*I'm not looking for the path of least resistance; I'm looking for the path of greatest glory. And that requires high-degree-of-difficulty prayers and lots of circling. I'm praying **ALAT prayers.** As long as it takes. God always delivers on His promises, but He does it on His timeline!” – Batterson*



God Impressions - by Joni Eareckson Tada

Live wisely among those who are not Christians and make the most of every opportunity. Let your conversation be gracious and effective so that you will have the right answer for everyone. Colossians 4:5-6



*Have you ever played with Silly Putty -- that pink, squeezable, rubbery clay that comes in a plastic egg? One of the most fun aspects of the putty is the way it will copy color pictures out of a magazine or comic book. I often think of that property of Silly Putty when I want to leave what I call "**God impressions**" on people.*

*You squeeze in a moment or stretch out the time to press your love of Christ up against someone. Maybe it's just a smile and a "God bless your day." Or returning a kindness with, "Thanks for helping me, and the next time you're near a Bible, look up Hebrews 6:10... it's definitely you!" Often, I'm able to leave a **God impression** on someone by singing a hymn. People see me in this wheelchair; hear me singing praises to God, and wonder, where in the world does her joy come from? It has to be God.*

*It's a way of pressing my life up against theirs for a brief moment so that when I peel away... I've left a **God impression** on that person -- however brief or fleeting it might have been. And once you encounter the Lord, you find yourself thirsty for something this world can't offer, hungry for something this world can't satisfy.*

*Busy as you may be, you still encounter many people during the course of your day. Press your love for Christ up against that friend down the street or that co-worker or that woman you regularly greet at the cash register. When you do, you'll leave them with a **God impression**... and make them thirsty for more.*

I often ask people I meet this question: *Is there anything I can pray for you?* I asked Mia, who works at the Post, that question last week and she said, *Yes! I need peace, health, and wealth.* I told her that Jesus could give her peace and briefly shared how He had changed my life (thankfully no one was waiting in line – a miracle!). I then gave her the enclosed booklet: **Would You Like to Know God Personally?** She took it eagerly and said she would read it. **I want to challenge you to step out in faith and give this booklet to someone this week. Because of you, someone's eternal address may be changed!**
