"As interesting as man's quest for God is, it merely points to a far more significant search that I want us to consider. That search was revealed long ago when God sent a prophet to deliver a message to King Asa in Jerusalem. Although the Lord was correcting Asa for his lack of faith and devotion, the prophetic word contained a declaration that God himself was involved in a unique search!

In describing God's love and desire to bless his people, the prophet declared a truth that is staggering in its implications: "For the eyes of the Lord move to and fro throughout the earth that He may strongly support those whose heart is completely His." II Chron. 16:9

God is on a search...The Creator of all things is looking throughout the whole earth for a certain kind of heart. He is searching for a human heart that will allow him to show how marvelously he can strengthen, help, and bless someone's life.

He isn't seeking someone with a high IQ or multiple talents, nor a clever speaker or person of influence. He revealed where his true interest lies when he sent the prophet Samuel to anoint the future king of Israel. God said, "Do not consider his appearance or his height...The Lord does not look at the things man looks at. Man looks at the outward appearance, but the Lord looks at the heart." I Sam. 16:7

A Huge Impression

When Jim Cymbala was about seven years old Howard Goss spoke at their church and left a big impression on his young heart. While in Manila to speak at a large church, Jim met Howard Goss's son who relayed this story to him about his father:

"I'll never forget one big camp meeting up in Canada when I was a kid. Every famous preacher was invited, and the crowds were tremendous. Our family arrived a day early, and the leaders were making out the schedule for the speakers. Meetings were held all day long—morning, afternoon, and night—and the visiting preachers all wanted to speak during the night rallies when the crows were largest. The preachers actually jockeyed around, hoping to get the biggest meetings for their preaching assignments.

Suddenly one of the leaders asked where my father was. He was in the prime of his ministry and was highly respected by everyone. They wanted to consult with him, but no one seemed to know where he was. They finally heard that he was last seen in the kitchen and dining hall area, so I went with them to find him. They could scarcely believe their eyes when they got to the kitchen. There was my dad on his hands and knees scrubbing the floor with some of the other workers.

Brother Goss, they said, "What are you doing here? We're making out the preaching schedule and wanted to know your preference? Oh, brothers, my dad replied, you've got so many good preachers here that you don't need to worry about me. But I found out that they're short of help here in the kitchen so I thought I'd lend a hand.

Tears welled up in our eyes as the son reminisced about his father, whose godly heart had left such a deep impression on so many. My dad was sure different, Pastor, he said. He was the real thing. His heart was so humble before the Lord that he had a special power in prayer and preaching. The Lord was really with my dad."

God can be with you and me in the same way as we walk with humble hearts before him. Just as pride drives away the blessings of heaven and precedes certain failure, a humble heart is like a magnet that draws the favor of God toward us. The Lord really does dwell with certain people in a special way. He is there because of the resting place provided for him by their humble hearts. It is a kind of divine favoritism verified by the Word of God.

This is what the Lord says: Heaven is my throne, and the earth is my footstool. Where is the house you will build for me? Where will my resting place be? This is the one I esteem: he who is humble and contrite in spirit, and trembles at my word. Isaiah 66:1-3

Let us humble our hearts before the Lord and seek his help and approval above all other things. Then by his grace we will personally experience the awesome power of his might as he surrounds us with blessings and favor. God will act in keeping with his promise: **Humble yourselves, therefore, under God's might hand, that he may lift you up in due time.**" I Peter 5:6. - Cymbala

He respects the centrality of our will and will not override it. He seeks godly character in us and for us, to fulfill the eternal destiny he has in mind for us.

But on the other hand, he is sensitive to the slightest move of the heart. This is the witness of both the Bible and of life. It doesn't matter whether you are "religious" or not ("Jew" or "Greek"), for "The same one is Lord of all, abounding in riches for all who call upon Him; for "Whoever will call upon the name of the Lord will be saved." Romans 10:12-13

When the inmost spirit of the individual who has no longer any hope other than God, God hears and responds without fail. It is as if he has a "heart monitor" installed in every person. And when the heart truly reaches out to God as God, no longer looking to itself or others, he responds with the gift of "life from above".



He was disappointed, however, when he discovered that he would have to miss the game due to his work schedule. He recorded the game so that he could watch it after work. On the way home he stopped at the store to pick up some snacks and while there he saw a friend who excitedly told him, "Wasn't that an awesome game -- our team won!"

"What's the use of seeing the game now", he thought to himself. But with snacks in hand and nothing else on the agenda, he decided to watch the game. It ended up being the most enjoyable game he had ever watched! Why? At half time his team was down by two touchdowns, but he didn't worry because he knew how the game ended! I've always appreciated this story because it reminds me that no matter what is happening at "half-time", we don't have to live in fear because we know how the story ends from the promises in Scripture!
